

DHS track excels at two meets

The DHS track and field team sent split squads to two meets last weekend, with 17 athletes traveling to compete at the prestigious Stanford Invitational on Friday and Saturday. The rest of the squad competed at the Thunder Invitational in Rocklin on Saturday.

At Stanford, Kaitlin Clancy was the top finisher, taking home a second place in the triple jump with a 35-06.00 effort.

The relay squads also had great success, with the girls 4x800 placing sixth out of 28 teams and breaking a DHS record. The team of Melinda Zavala, Hilary Teaford, Christine

Bowlus and Hannah Krovetz ran a 9:47.16, breaking the old time of 9:54.24 set in 2003. The girls 4 x 400 relay team — made up of Zavala, Krovetz, Elliana Bisgaard-Church and Josephine Devanbu — placed fifth with a season-best time of 4:05.08.

The boys 4x800 team, paced by brothers Drew and Matt Petersen, Hans Faye and anchored by Corey Coates' outstanding split of 1:57.1, placed seventh in 8:16.23.

Individually, Coates (4:23.11) and Matt Petersen (4:24.04) placed 11th and 12th in the mile, both running personal bests. Petersen also placed 10th in the 3000 with a time of 8:47.65. Bowlus finished 12th-place in the girls race in 10:36.78.

The 3,000 also was a successful race for the Blue Devils at the Thunder Invite. Charlotte Ter Haar won it with a lifetime best of 10:50.39 and teammates Nora Norvell (third) and Dana Randall (fifth) were right behind. Grayson Hough took second in the boys race.

In the field events for the varsity, in was Rachel Brooks placing fifth in the discus and Anna Schickele taking fourth in the pole vault.

DHS' Lara Schoen was fifth in the 800.

Several JV athletes won their events at the Thunder Invite. Maddie Trost won the high jump with a leap of 4'10", Sierra Clark

led the long jumpers with a 15'0.25" hop, and Ian Rock set a frosh/soph meet record with a 51.89 in the 400.

The JV girls 4x400 relay team of Lauren Holtz, Naomi Hester, Jeanne Beveridge, and Clark, placed first in 4:23.26. Clark, Holtz, Beveridge, Halley Rainer, Tess Williams, Cassie Kang, and Chris Mellon all posted top-five finishes for the Blue Devil girls JV.

For the DHS JV boys, Rock, Matthew Austin, Stephan Hill, Brian De La Mora and Ryan Greenough finished in the top five in their respective events.

DHS boys golf

The Blue Devils opened up the Delta Valley Conference season the right way, taking first place in DVC tournament No. 1 held at Teal Bend Golf Club on Tuesday. DHS carded a 402 to defeat second-place Franklin by 21 strokes.

Halston Minnieweather led the way for the Devils with a 78 to take second individually. Niclas Wesemann and Scott Raber tied for third overall at 80, and Taylor Lowe and Patrick Mullen each shot 82s to tie for sixth. Though only the top five players score for the team, Jordan Barody's 83 put him in ninth place individually.

"Today's performance — six players in the top 10 — demonstrates the depth of this year's team," DHS coach Karl Ronning."

UCD women's golf

Chelsea Stelzmillier fired a

2-under 69 on Tuesday to stay in a tie for the lead, while Alice Kim carded a 70 and is tied for fourth, as the standout Aggie sophomores helped the UCD women's golf team move into a tie with Idaho for first place after two rounds of the Anteater Invitational.

The Ags fired a tournament-best team score of 9-over 293 and are knotted with the Vandals at 29-over 597 heading into today's final round.

After starting the day in fourth place, UCD used a team effort to move up. Lauren Dobashi had a 77 and is tied for 20th, Jessica Yam had her second straight 79 and is tied for 30th, and Katie Sisler shot a 77 to jump to a tie for 52nd.

JV girls soccer

The Blue Devils continued their rampage through the Delta Valley Conference with an 11-0 thumping of the host Laguna Creek Cardinals on Monday. DHS' offensive explosive featured hat tricks from three different players.

Sarah Sadler recorded all three of her goals in the first half, with one assist each from sisters Allie and Olivia Muller as well as Morgan Smith. After Sadler returned the favor to Olivia Muller for a goal, it was Sarah Chase's turn to triple up. She scored twice from deep and then added a header off a brilliant cross from Jennie Hawkins.

Anna Maria Gilbertson was the third DHS player to record a hat trick, before Hawkins

completed the scoring with a 35-footer. Holly Buhlman played a very solid game in central midfield and keepers Ali Robertson and Sami Houck kept a clean sheet for the Blue Devils.

go to 3-0 in Delta Valley Conference play by topping The Herd, 25-10, 25-20, 25-12, the San Diego native said "volleyball, especially in high school, is so much bigger in Southern California ... a higher level of skill and passion."

Walejeski hopes he's introduced the Devils to both: "We just talked about that in practice (Monday). Maintaining a level of intensity, focus and team unity. We've shown great improvement (in every area) since the beginning of the season."

Now 4-6 overall, that improvement was evident Tuesday evening at The Cage.

In topping Elk Grove, DHS saw a trio of seniors protect the net, fire scary kill shots and provide sets that looked like they came from players in their fourth year of a program — not just starting out.

Jordan Roby, Dan Contreras and Glen Lischeske were everywhere.

During the first set, Contreras and Lischeske each defended four dead-on slam attempts by The Grove. Lischeske added nine kills and held serve for a four-point run at the end of the first set.

Roby assisted on seven kills and had a couple of nice plays to keep points alive.

At one point, the passion overflowed.

Lischeske and a trio of teammates watched a set fall harmlessly between them for an Elk Grove point. Not happy with the miscommunication, Lischeske used his next opportunity to deliver his signature left-handed thunder to make it 14-6, and the locals canceled out their visitors 11-4 the rest of the way.

"Glen is probably one of the most talented players around," his coach praises. "We've provided a foundation for these guys. I told (Lischeske) he is a good player. I'm gonna make you great."

So far, so good.

Walejeski, the fitness and wellness coordinator at Peak Performance, is assisted by Sheldon graduate Brian Martin. Martin is a student at Sacramento State who played volleyball at SHS. Walejeski played at Pierce College in Los Angeles and Morse High in San Diego.

"We've been doing conditioning since January," Walejeski continues. "And we're looking for ways to (expand) the program in the off season."

But other teams in the Sacramento Valley need to join in the enthusiasm. In the Sac-Joaquin Section, volleyball has fewer boys teams than all sports except badminton.

"Our goal?" Walejeski repeats the question. "Increase the level of play, accountability in the program and try to get the community behind us."

The loss puts Elk Grove at 1-10 and 0-3 in the DVC, but the big challenge appears Thursday as the Devils travel to undefeated Franklin (7-0) for a 6 p.m. encounter.
